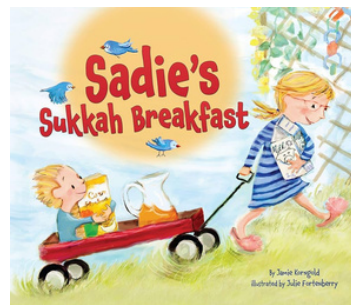
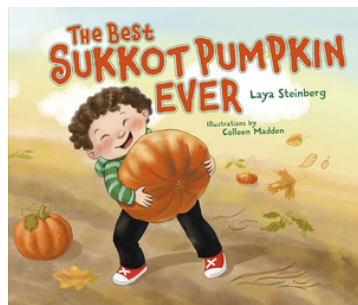
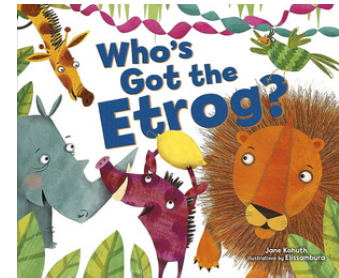
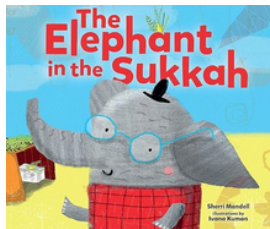


SUKKOT

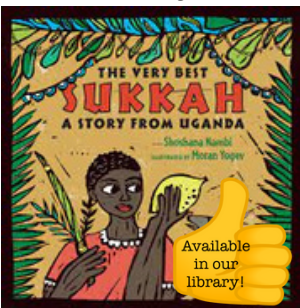
September 29th - October 6th

Sukkot (say "sook-koht" or "sook-kuss") is a week-long Jewish celebration of the fall season. It is a festival for giving thanks for many things, like food and shelter. The holiday celebrates the farmer's yearly harvest, which takes place in the fall. Sukkot also commemorates the biblical story of the Jews' escape from Egypt. They wandered for 40 years through the desert, living in temporary shelters. During Sukkot, Jewish families build a temporary hut or shelter in their yard. It is called a sukkah (say "sook-kaw"). Families will decorate their huts with leaves, fruit and vegetables. They will also put up their kids' artwork. It is traditional to eat meals in the sukkah.
